### Floor Schedule and Procedure

- **Suspension Bills:** Today, the House will consider several bills on the Suspension calendar. Bills considered on the Suspension calendar are debatable for 40 minutes; may not be amended; and require a two-thirds vote for passage. If a recorded vote is requested, it will be postponed.
  - 1) **H.R.2964** - To amend the Lacey Act Amendments of 1981 to treat nonhuman primates as prohibited wildlife species under that Act, to make corrections in the provisions relating to captive wildlife offenses under that Act, and for other purposes (Rep. Eddie Bernice Johnson (TX) – Natural Resources)
  - 2) **H.R.3702** - Montana Cemetery Act of 2007 (Rep. Rehberg – Natural Resources)
  - 3) **H.Res.1247** - Supporting the goals and ideals of "American Eagle Day", and celebrating the recovery and restoration of the American bald eagle, the national symbol of the United States (Rep. David Davis (TN) – Natural Resources)
  - 4) **H.Res.1199** - Commending the Orange County Water District and its employees for their sound financial management and innovative groundwater management, water quality, water efficiency, and environmental programs, on its 75th anniversary (Rep. Loretta Sanchez – Natural Resources)

Res. 1029** - Congratulating and recognizing Mr. Juan Antonio "Chi-Chi" Rodriguez for his continued success on and off of the golf course, for his generosity and devotion to charity, and for his exemplary dedication to the intellectual and moral growth of thousands of low-income and disadvantaged youth in our country (Rep. Gutierrez – Oversight and Government Reform)
- 13) **H. R. 6150** - To designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 14500 Lorain Avenue in Cleveland, Ohio, as the "John P. Gallagher Post Office Building". (Rep. Kucinich – Oversight and Government Reform)
- 14) **H. R. 6085** - To designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 42222 Rancho Las Palmas Drive in Rancho Mirage, California, as the "Gerald R. Ford Post Office Building". (Rep. Bono Mack – Oversight and Government Reform)
