Dear Mr. Speaker, Mr. Majority Leader, Mr. Majority Whip, and Mr. Chairman:

Well played! And three cheers for the One Big Beautiful bill, which we wholeheartedly support.

Its historic tax cuts for senior citizens feature a \$4,000 deduction and no tax on tips or overtime. It also significantly extends the 2017 tax cuts, increasing the child tax credit from \$2,000 to \$2,500 and indexing it for inflation. Additionally, the ten Health Savings Account (HSA) provisions expand HSAs to Medicare, the ACA, and Medicaid in some states and add the helpful health care tax credit and ICHRA provisions in the bill. This truly makes it One Big Beautiful bill.

We urge all members of the U.S. House to vote for it whenever possible: in the Budget Committee, the Rules Committee, and on the House floor. These opportunities do not come around often, and allowing disagreements about one or more provisions to lead to a No vote will prevent the substantial and historic down payment on reforms that the bill proposes, resulting in no bill at all.

We at the HSA Coalition have a rule when lobbying: don't say No to Yes. This rule has served the HSA industry well. We have grown from zero Americans with an HSA to over 60 million people with a Health Savings Account—and we achieved this, in large part, by not saying No to Yes.
