Dear Chairman Smith:

On behalf of DoorDash, I write to commend your leadership to support American workers by including independent contractors in the “No Tax On Tips” provision of this week’s budget reconciliation bill.

Since President Donald Trump introduced the concept last year, “No Tax On Tips” has earned widespread and bipartisan support because it gives tax relief and fairness for millions of hard working Americans.

Dashers, the independent contractors who deliver on the DoorDash platform, highly value the independence and flexibility that dashing provides. In 2024 alone, more than 7 million people delivered on DoorDash to achieve their financial goals and earned more than \$16 billion on their own terms. “No Tax On Tips” would allow them to take home even more pay.

To date, more than 40,000 Dashers have written to their Congressional representatives asking for fairness in this tax proposal. We are grateful that this text reflects their voices.

We commend you, your leadership, and the members of the Ways and Means Committee on this important first step and stand ready to assist you to support dashers and other independent workers.
