

House Budget Resolution Fosters Fiscal Responsibility and Economic Prosperity

The House will soon vote on H. Con. Res. 14, to establish the budget for FY 2025 and set the budgetary levels for fiscal years 2026 through 2034. The resolution adopted by the House Budget Committee takes a decisive and necessary step in advancing President Trump's policy agenda. It is crucial that the House adopt this resolution in order to fix a broken payment system, root out waste and fraud throughout the government, and extend tax cuts for working families and entrepreneurs.
