Dear Member of the U.S. House of Representatives;

As Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) with 16 of its 17 members located in the Commonwealth, I am writing you to make you aware of the bipartisan bill, the **SCORE Act (H.R. 4312)**, that the PSAC and its members strongly supports.

Student-athletes and schools across the country have been advocating for passage of this bill because it effectively tackles our priorities: preempting the patchwork of state laws and providing liability protections so student-athletes can play by one set of rules. Importantly, the bill also addresses an existential threat for Division II schools, ensuring student-athletes are not employees of schools.

Together with the NCAA's internal reforms, the SCORE Act provides student-athletes with unprecedented representation and benefits including comprehensive health and safety protections, NIL contract rights, and protections against predatory agents.

The SCORE Act would establish the first-ever federally protected rights to health and wellness and academic benefits, NIL contract protections and other guarantees that currently only exist in NCAA bylaws.

Also, the SCORE Act would grant only limited antitrust exemptions to all conferences equally and to the NCAA – specifically to enforce academic and eligibility standards, as well as prevent runaway spending and significantly strengthen the House injunction provisions,

Additionally, The SCORE Act would establish the first ever federal mandate for broad based sport opportunities – including Olympic sports.

The bill could come up for a vote very soon and we urge all Representative of the Pennsylvania Delegation, to cosponsor and vote in favor of this important bill.
